Le RAPPORT du CAPITAINE, Captain's Report

Framingham on the Sudbury December 2005

Hi Folks,

As we draw to a close the current campaign season we look to the very busy season that approaches. Based on the meeting at the beginning of November, I think that everyone has a good idea of what we will be involved in.

Thanks to everyone who came to the Regimental Drill and Meeting. Frank and Rosemary Marini were, as usual, perfect hosts for the Drill and gathering. The Line looked great as we went through our maneuvers. Welcome to Mary Harder who came out to drill with us – she looked like a pro! After the drill we gathered for a pot-luck lunch and jumped straight into the meeting. Bill, Dana, and I presented the schedule and events for the coming year – which are significant. The meeting ended pretty much on time as Dana predicted.

We gathered again in Plymouth for their Thanksgiving Parade. Fortunately, the weather was quite nice and we gathered a very nice crowd. Anita kept us well fed and warm with stew and warm cider. There is a great write-up on this event later in the newsletter.

Earlier this week, I had a great conversation with Pete Schaaphock of the BAR. Basically, the conversation was similar to the conversation I had with Paul Ackermann with the additional comments on the BAR/CL/BB meeting at Yorktown. The BAR is pushing for 3 events next year: Southbury, CT, Ridgefield, CT, and the Grand Reconnaissance at White Plains, NY. The Grand Reconnaissance is actually a reenactment of the French and American columns probing the NY defenses in preparation for an attack on

NY. Pete did not think that there would be an event in New Jersey and did not want to support the event in Philadelphia for the same reasons that we didn't want to support the event. The BAR is also very excited about the Prelude to Victory event at Williamsburg.

Building the French numbers for Yorktown is an important goal for next year. Pete reiterated the BAR's approach of adding 40 men in French uniform. The approach is to talk to the early war units in the BAR and asking them to convert. This way they can have cohesive units with a fixed command structure. For Yorktown the BAR and the Park Service is only looking at units that exist within the BAR/CL/BB. This removes the BAR from vetting individual units, which makes it easier for the BAR and the Park to invite units to the event.

Finally, Pete and I discussed the Yorktown event itself. There will be events at both Yorktown and Endview Plantation. It was a good meeting with representatives from the BAR, CL (Chip Gnam and Jeff Lambert), BB (Don Beale) and the Park. Don Beale was able to get the entire town of York as his encampment. As a result, there will be nothing modern in the town. The 23rd will be camped at the Fusilier's redoubt - which is at the Yorktown Victory Center. There are planned attacks at both the redoubts 9 & 10 as well as the Fusilier's redoubt. One of the planning issues is all the "side shows" going on by the various historical and fraternal organizations. All of these "shows" have requested reenactor presence, however each show has to be managed by the event and Regimental staffs. One of the consequences is that access to Yorktown on Thursday will be limited due to the events. Pete and I also discussed the organizational structure for the French Army. Pete officially asked if I would take the overall command of French forces, which I accepted. No surprise there.

As 2006 approaches, more folks are interested in the Yorktown event as French. I was contacted recently by Lauzan's Legion from Wisconsin. I'm currently working with them to find a way for them to join the Continental Line. Currently Lauzan's is expecting on fielding four men at arms and an artillery company of six. We are still working with the BAR to grow their Line as well as finding other folks who want to come on board with us. Recruiting will be a big item for us this year. So, if you have any folks who you think would be interested, the let Bill, Dana, and I know.

We are currently looking at work parties for the coming year. The notices will probably go out on the website, so stay tuned! That's all I have for now.
