Cartridge Rolling Party, Wednesday, May 10 ~ Arrival: We will be meeting at the Meadow Brook Village Community Center at 7:00 PM, Directions: Frank's number is (978) 838-2112 - just in case! From Sudbury, Framingham, Concord: Take Route 62 through Hudson. Stay on RT 62 through Rotary. You will come to a three way fork in the road. Take River Street on Left. Travel for about 3 Miles. Look for Meadow Brook Village on the right. Turn Right onto Brook Lane. Travel 1/4 mile down Brook Lane. It's #59 Brook Lane on the Right. From 290 and 495: Take 290 to the Solomon Pond Mall Exit. Turn Right at end of Ramp. Stay in far Left Lane. Travel straight for 1 mile. You will come to a rotary; take first right onto River Road. Travel for about 3 miles on River Road. You will pass the 1790 Farm. Meadow Brook Village will be on your Left. Turn Left onto Brook Lane. Travel 1/4 Mile down Brook Lane. It's #59 Brook Lane on Right. **Details:** We currently have 800 tubes rolled and 25 pounds of powder, the regiment will be providing all the paper, powder and equipment to roll cartridges. Please try to be there on time, we have a lot to get done.

Board of Directors meeting Monday, May 16.~ Arrival: The meeting is open to all members of the Regiment, we will be meeting at the Malecki's house at 7:30 PM. Directions: From 495 north or south take route 20 west Northborough exit. I believe it is 24B. From anywhere else just take router 20 West. After going over the 495 bridge in Marlborough or getting off 495 in Marlborough, you will come to a traffic light. Go thru that light. You will start down a hill, at the bottom of this hill is another traffic light; you will go thru that light. You will see a McDonalds on the right and a Wendy's on the left at the light

Keep going west. As your traveling you will see a restaurant on the right called the country villa. Shortly after, ou will see the "Entering Northborough" sign. DRILL & DISTAFF GATHERING,

Saturday, May 14. ~ Arrival: Drill & distaff gathering will begin at 10:30am. It will be only 90 minutes long so please try to arrive on time. Directions: We'll be at the Old Town Hall in Stow, MA – many thanks to Dave Walrath for securing the location. Old Town Hall is on Route 117 in Stow, one block west of the intersection of Routes 117 & 62. There is limited parking on the street; additional parking is available at the "new" Town Hall directly across the street. From the East: Take Rt. 117(W) to Rt. 62 (Stow Ctr.); Old Town Hall is on the right, one block west of the Rt. 117/62 intersection. From the West: Take I-495 to Rt. 117 (E) -Old Town Hall is about 8 miles on your left, just before the Rt. 62 intersection. From the South: Take Rt. 62(E) to Route 117; turn right and it will be one block on your right. From the North, take Rt. 2 or Rt. 111 to Rt 62(W); take Rt. 62 to Rt. 117 and turn right for one block. **Details:** This is will be our last chase to drill before the 2005 season goes into full swing.

Battle for Newbury, May 21 - 22. ~ **Arrival:** Camp set up will start on Friday May 20. **Directions:** From Route I-95 in Newbury to the Little Farm (red line) and return (small green line). Take the Scotland Road Newbury exit. If coming from NH and the north, take a left at the end of the ramp. If coming from MA and the south, bear right off the ramp. Follow Scotland Road for approximately 2.8 miles, then take a right onto Parker Street (at lights). Follow Parker Street as it joins Route 1 South. Go around the traffic circle three-quarters of the way, then exit (200 feet beyond Dunkin Donuts) and take a quick right back onto Parker Street. Continue on Parker Street, and take a right in front of Newbury Town Hall onto High Road/Route 1A South. Little's Lane will be on the left. Watch for small Little Farm-Historic New England sign. To return to Rt. 95, retrace route to the Rt. 1 traffic circle, go north on Route 1 for less than a eighth of a mile, take a left across the highway, then a right onto Parker St. **Details:** The basic setting for the weekend is that of a British landing party coming upon an active privateering community along the New England coast. This represents one of any such situations which happened from 1774 to 1778, from the lower Connecticut coast to Falmouth, Maine. Adam Philippe Conte de Custine



The later general of the French revolution army was born to 02.04.1740 in Metz. During the seven-year-old of war he gained his first military experiences. It works satisfactorily in this campaign and receives its own Dragoon regiment. This it exchanges however with an infantry regiment and

can with this to America be embarked. During the war in America Custine was particularly characterised with the siege of Yorktown. He was appointed the Maréchal de Camp and governor von Toulon.

In the year 1789 he is selected as a representative of the aristocracy of Metz into the French national assembly. In the course of the revolution he put down also his count title. In the national assembly he was to be found rather with the liberals forces.

In October 1791 occurred it pulled again in the rank of a lieutenant general the army. With his soldiers "general was cord beard" much likes. He became a kommandierender general of the Vogesenarmee. After combat of Valny Custine advanced on the area of the German Reich. Occupied by Landau from it to 29.09.1792 Speyer and drew to 21.10.1792 into the badly defended Mainz and on the following day combatless into Frankfurt. It spread through calls the ideas of the French revolution and presented aristocracy and Klerus substantial deliveries.

To 02.12.1792 it was struck by Prussian-hessian troops with Frankfurt. Further retreat engagements followed, like for example to 06.01.1793 with Hocheim. After cross after further attacks of the German realm Reich between being gene and he withdrew himself after combat with Alzey to 31.03.1793 on Landau.

Robespierre sent back Custine to the north army and handed to it over the supreme command, however he was struck again with high home by the Austrian troops. On initiative Marats and Billaud Varennes'wurde it before the wohlfahrtsausschuss accused, deliberately that a general of the army to have abused and the interest of the republic by agreements with the enemies of France have harmed. He was condemned, despite more einner sent defense, to 27.08.1793 to death and already executed on the next day, the judgement.

Its desire, that its son Renaud Philippe Custine (1768 - 1794), by the publication of its papers, the honour of the father to restore should go, could not unfortunately into fulfilment. Only few months later the son, who served its father than aide, followed it into the death of late published the later general Baraguay d'Hilliers the papers under the title ""
