SOUTH BOSTON / EVACUATION DAY PARADE, Sunday, March 18 ~ Arrival: No later than 11:00am since the roads surrounding South Boston close due to the parade. Details: Folks this is the official start to our season and Steven has asked the Parade Committee for a little extra money for us and they gave it to us. So the idea here is to not disappoint the wonderful people of Southie and put on a great show. Just a reminder that winter is still in effect so even though the exterior will be your regimentals please make sure that you have warm clothes on underneath, since it did snow a little last year. Directions: The South Boston by-pass Road can be accessed from Exit 18 on the Expressway or the new right-hand exit just before the end of the turnpike. Take a Left onto Congress Street and your first Left onto A Street and a Right into the rear gate of the Gillette parking lot. Dress: French, white gaiters, plenty of water (it's a 4 mile parade).

Saturday, March 31 ~ Arrival: The event starts at 9:00am, so please try to be there no later then 8:45am Details: What we plan on doing on this day is to get together many of the other units that will be attending Battle Road and get accustomed to working with them. You will need to be dressed in full 4th Middlesex kits with muskets. Please leave your powder at home, the park will provide powder for this one. Directions: Parking for this year's event will be at Lincoln North. From I-95/Route 128 - Take the Route 2A exit (Exit 30) towards Concord/ East Lexington. At the end of the ramp take a Right on Route 2A West. Follow Route 2A for 1.3 miles. Take a right onto Hanscom Road. Follow Hanscom Road for .6 miles. Take a left onto Old Bedford Road. Follow Old Bedford Road for .2 miles, Lincoln North office park will be on your left. Once you have parked, follow the path at the back end of the parking lot to Old Virginia Road and onto the Hartwell Tavern.


