Note location: Minute Man Visitor Center, Lincoln, MA Join Park staff to learn/practice the Norfolk Drill. Bring your musket, bayonet and empty cartridge box. If you took the February session, use this class to perfect what you learned last month.



Evacuation Day Parade, Boston, MA, Sunday March 14th ~ Arrival: Please try to arrive no later than 11:00am since the roads surrounding South Boston close due to the parade. **Details**: Folks this is the official start to our season and Steven has asked the Parade Committee for a little extra money for us and they gave it to us. So the idea here is to not disappoint the wonderful people of Southie and put on a great show. Just a reminder that winter is still in effect so even though the exterior will be your regimentals please make sure that you have warm clothes on underneath since it did snow a little last year. We are doing a head count for this event so please contact me and let me know that you are attending. Directions: The South Boston by-pass Road can be accessed from Exit 18 on the Expressway or the new right-hand exit just before the end of the turnpike. Take the By-pass Road to the Congress Street exit (this is the last exit before the Ted Williams Tunnel). Take a Left onto Congress Street and your first Left onto A Street and a Right into the rear gate of the Gillette parking lot. Dress: French, white gaiters, plenty of water (it's a 4 mile parade).

Regimental Drill, Sudbury, MA, March 18th ~ Arrival: Please plan on arriving no later than 6:00pm at the Wayside Inn. Details: This will be our second official drill of the year. If possible please attend the drill in full kit (Saintonge). If you don't have time to get dressed before the drill, please make sure you bring your hat, cartridge box and musket. Directions: From the East. Follow Rt. 20 West to Sudbury. Take a right at large green sign "Wayside Inn Road" and the Inn is 1/4 miles down on your right (parking on your left). From the West. Follow Rt. 20 turn onto Wayside Inn Road for approximately 1 mile, and the Inn is on your left (parking on your right).

Article 8

The Equipment of the Soldier

The neckstock will be of white dimity 16 lines wide (1-1/3") lined in good white toile.

The sleeves of the shirt will be without cuffs. The Sergeants and Fourriers (Quartermaster-Sergeant) will be able to wear cuffs of 12 to 14 lines high (1-1/4"). The shirts will comprise a hem which will be 2 lines (1/6").

The Cadets-Gentilshommes will wear what they were provided by the Administration of the Royal Military School.


The soldier will have 1 pair of gaiters in white toile for parade; for service he will have gaiters of blackened toile and for winter gaiters of black wool completely lined in toile. The gaiters will be garnished with 20 to 24 small buttons, in toile for the white gaiters and in leather for the black gaiters. The gaiter will rise as far as the kneecap of the knee and attaches by one buttonhole made in the place of the lower button to the second button of the breeches on which the bottom buttonhole of the gaiter will come to be buttoned crossed on the other side. The kneestrap will be of toile or material of the gaiter and will attach with buckles of brass, which are squared inside and rounded on the outer edge.

The cartridge box of the Grenadiers, Chassuers, and Fusilers, with the exception of the Fourriers and Sergeants which will be smaller and lighter, remain in the ancient form with the ordinary flap, without the plaque and will perform better conforming to the model which will be used by each Regiment.

The shoulder strap will be white buff leather of 4'-10" in length and the width will be 27 lines (2-1/4") and conforms to the model which is currently in use. The Under-Officers of the companies of Fusiliers will wear the saber in the same manner. The sword belt will cross on the coat with the shoulder belt which will pass over the sword belt.

The sling of the fusil and the drum sling of the drummers will be equally of white buff leather, the length and width as regulated.

The haversack will be of calf-skin with the hair on and conforming to the dimensions in use. It will contain bread for 4 days in addition to the belongings and small equipment which the soldier will carry on the march. Each soldier is to have a cloth sack for distributions, with which he will be able to cover for bed.


