You will notice that this newsletter is a little light on content as much preparation went into the expedition North. I encourage all of you to contribute to next month's newsletter. We've had a very productive month this past July. For the July Drill we had approximately 10 people join us. In the ranks were 3 new recruits as well as some of our friends from the Bourbonnais. We spent about an hour working on marching maneuvers and about an hour on drill. The musket drill is looking very clean and crisp. We've also had two very successful work parties at the Taskovic's house. During the first work party we were able to roll over 800 cartridge tubes and rolled almost 600 rounds. Check in: All Redcoats to Rebels participants must register in the main parking lot near the Security and First Aid building. If you have not sent in a liability waiver please have one ready at sign in. There will be blanks available at registration however we would appreciate it if you have these ready prior to arriving to expedite check in. Blank forms have been sent to unit contact people attached to this email. In order to speed up the registration process this year if you have not presubmitted a liability waiver then you will be asked to step out of line to fill it out and then return to line. We have a far greater number of pre-submitted waivers this year and if you take the time to fill it out and carry it with you to the event the registration process should be very quick.

When you register you will be given a ID that you must carry to receive discounts in both the gift shop and food services. These discounts only apply to items that are not already on sale. You will also be issued a parking ID that must be filled out and place on your dashboard. You will be directed as to where to park. It is essential that we keep the main lot clear for daytime guests to the

event. You will also receive a listing of the weekends activities at that time. Please check to see if your unit has anything scheduled and arrive to the event on time. Drafts of the both days activities are attached to this email

### **Scheduled events:**

Please remember that the Village is open to the general public until 8 o'clock on Saturday August 7.

Back by popular demand the Saturday Evening Jolly will take place in the Bullard Tavern from 8PM to 10 PM on Saturday evening This year Sign of the Roaring Lion will be once again be hosting and entertaining at the event. You may bring your own drinks to the event since there will be no cash bar.

In response to your offers we are featuring more units this year in demonstrations than in past years. Please check the daily mapguides to see if you are scheduled for special programming. Please make sure you arrive at the location on time. Copies of this schedule events will be given out at registration. Please look over carefully. If you didn't get scheduled for something that you requested we set the program on a first come first served basis. Units should still feel free to march and drill in their campsites and any craft or trade activities are encourage. Events only for participants such as the Saturday night Jolly do not appear on the visitor mapguide. There is still time to make minor changes so if you have questions or concerns contact jobrien@osv.org as soon as possible.

If you plan to take part in the daily battle, there will be an Officer's Meeting each morning at 9:30 outside the Blacksmith Shop. If you plan to take part in the battle you must have your officer attend this meeting.

Because so much requested straw bedding was not used in past years, we are going to protect it under cover in certain areas. Your welcome letter which you will receive at registration will instruct you as to where to find it for your unit.

Wood and kindling will be at strategic places in close proximity to your camps this year. Please take what you need but remember that others need wood as well. We will monitor the wood supply throughout the weekend to make sure you have enough. Locations will be listed in your welcome letter which you receive at registration.

Due to popular requests we will not be pre-digging fire pits this year and will allow you to dig your own. Please fill in the pit when you leave. Please leave the area as you found it and place trash near the trash receptacles located near your campsites. We have a very short time to get the museum ready for visitors the day following the event and we appreciate your help.

Ice will be available for sale at the Village Grill (Little Cakes) across from Bullard Tavern Cafeteria entrance during their operating hours. Please check map guide for open times.

GRAND ENCAMPMENT at FORTTABER, New Bedford, MA ~ Details: A Grand Encampment of Revolutionary War Soldiers will commemorate the 1778 burning of the village of New Bedford. The event is open to the Northern Dept. and is scheduled to take place August 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>, 2010. All the standard amenities will be provided. There is a snack shack and a swimming beach on site. Directions: Fort Taber Park is located on Clark's Point in New Bedford, MA: From Boston take RT 128 South to RT 24 South to RT 140 South. Take RT 195 East to New Bedford. From Providence take RT 195 East to New Bedford. Reaching New Bedford from 195East, everyone take RT 18 South to its end. Continue south for 1.5 miles to the end at Clark's Point. The Fort Taber Park entrance is at the eastern edge of the park marked with a large sign.

MARLBOROUGH LABOR DAY PARADE, Monday, September 6. ~ Arrival: All members are asked to arrive at the assembly point (Pleasant & Chestnut Streets) no later than 11am. Directions: The directions are the same as in previous years. For first-timers: 1-495 (exit 25A, Route 85), take a right onto Route 85 at the second set of lights (at the 99 Restaurant) and follow Route 85 through part of Hudson and into Marlborough. Continue to follow Route 85 until you reach the parking areas, not too far beyond where you cross Main Street. Parking: Parking is available on Route 85 at Replacement Auto Parts, Inc., Verizon Co., St. Mary's Credit Union, and Community National Bank, or on nearby streets. Details: A shuttle bus service will operate from 10:00am until 11:30am between the

American Legion Building (86 Maple Street) and parade assembly area. Persons with private cars or those being dropped off are encouraged to use this service. Portolets are located at both assembly and ending areas of the parade. The parade is 1.7 miles and will end at the American Legion Building. Dress is French, white gaiters. Bring full canteens and whatever you have for cartridges.

# Please observe the following guidelines during the "From Redcoats to Rebels" event at Old Sturbridge Village August 6 7 & 8, 2010

## Check in and set up

- Check-in and set-up will ONLY be between the hours 3:00-8:00 on Friday August 6, 2010 and 6:00 9:00 AM on Saturday August 7, 2010. Camp set-up will ONLY be permitted during these hours.
- Private motor vehicles are not allowed in the historic Village before 5:15 on Friday. Please plan on transporting your gear on handcarts, which will be provided, if you arrive before 5:15. (Camps will be ½ to ½ mile from the parking area.) Vehicles will be allowed to drive in to unload after 5:15. You are asked to **unload and remove your vehicle as soon as possible** as limited numbers of vehicle may be allowed into the Village at a time.
- The breakdown of camps may not commence until after 5:00 PM on Sunday August 8, and must be completed by 8:00 PM.
- Only historically authentic camping is permitted at Old Sturbridge Village. No modern camping is allowed. For those not wishing to camp in a historical manner, there are several public campgrounds and hotels in the immediate area. (Go to <a href="http://www.sturbridge.org/lodging.htm">http://www.sturbridge.org/lodging.htm</a> for details.)

### Hours and access

- We are open to the public from 9:30 AM until 5:00 PM and open from 5:00-8:00 on Saturday evening for a *Twilight Encampment*. You should count on being available to the public during those hours.
- You are welcome to tour the museum exhibits and grounds between the hours of 9:30 AM and 5:00 PM, when we are open to the public. For the safety of all, we ask you to please confine yourself to the camps at other times. **Touring the museum exhibits or grounds "after hours" is prohibited.**
- All entrance and egress of the Village grounds before 9:30 AM or after 5:00 P.M, must be through the gate at the Security office ONLY. Please check in and out with the Security officer on duty.

## Safety and Emergency's

- In case of fire or medical emergencies, call 511 (NOT 911) from any Village phone, or contact our Security office for assistance.
- For non-emergency concerns after hours, contact the Security office in person or at (508) 347-0273.
- For your own health, please drink plenty of water throughout the day, and rest as needed.

## Fire

- Light fires only in approved locations.
- Leave no fire unattended, and extinguish fires thoroughly before departure.
- Fire extinguishers will be placed at your campsite, and their locations identified.

#### **Firearms**

- Please follow all your unit's normal precautions with firearms and edged tools and weapons, and obey your unit officer's commands.
- All weapons, both edged and firearms, shall be used and stored in a safe and deliberate manner at all times.
- Firearms may ONLY be discharged at times and places designated by the Old Sturbridge Village safety officer. Random firing or firing demonstrations are prohibited, and there shall be no gunfire in camps.
- ONLY weapons inspected and passed by the Old Sturbridge Village safety officer may be fired.
- **NO** live ammunition should be brought to this event.
- In any mock battle, only powder shall be placed in firearms: **no paper, no wadding, no ramming**.
- You must be 16 years of age or older to carry a weapon.
- For the safety of all, obey the commands of your unit's officers and the Old Sturbridge Village safety officer.

## **Alchol and Drugs**

- Drunkenness at any time is strictly prohibited.
- Possession or use of illegal drugs is strictly prohibited.
- No alcoholic beverages may be open or consumed during hours the museum is open to the public.
- Failure to adhere to these rules may result in immediate expulsion from the premises and/or arrest.

### **Practical considerations**

• Rest rooms are located in the Bullard Tavern and the Countryside Learning Center. There are portable toilets available as well.

- Water from the pump on the Village Common is potable (Sturbridge town water). Potable water is also available at the Bullard Tavern, the Countryside Learning Center, spigots at the Fitch House and Fenno Barn, and "bubblers" throughout the grounds.
- Please use the designated trash receptacles at your campsite or located throughout the grounds.
- No pets or other animals are allowed in the Village.
- Smoking is permitted outdoors but is NOT permitted in any building. During the hours of 9:30 AM 5:00 PM please confine smoking to historic-style pipes or cigars: no cigarettes, please.
- Firewood will be provided near your campsite. Please do not take firewood except from designated locations, do not cut any standing timber.
- Any children under 16 years of age who may accompany you must be under adult supervision at all times.
- Keep your valuables safe. Old Sturbridge Village assumes no responsibility for the loss of any personal property or equipment.
- For the consideration of all, we ask that "lights out" and quiet be observed after midnight.
- For the consideration of all, no radios, televisions, tape or CD players are permitted.

• The Museum Gift Shop and New England Bookstore is open from 10:00 AM - 6:00 PM on Saturday, and on Sunday from 10:00 AM - 6:00 PM.

### **Historical Considerations**

- Please adhere to the authenticity guidelines of your unit, and strive to maintain an appropriate appearance for the period you represent while the museum is open.
- Be considerate of our family audience; e.g. no ribald humor or profanity during open hours, and no prostitute impressions.
- No impressions of famous personages are allowed without prior written permission from Old Sturbridge Village.
- Only historically authentic camping is permitted at Old Sturbridge Village. Please keep all modern amenities such as coolers, plastic tarps, etc. well hidden during the hours when the museum is open (9:30 AM- 5:00 PM) (This includes the toys, electronic games, strollers, playpens etc. of any children in historic costume who may accompany you.)
- Historically a very few women did keep their true gender hidden and 'pass' as men and serve in uniform. IF a female participant chooses to do the same, she must strive to remain "undetected" and not advertise her femininity. Otherwise, one's historic costume should correctly reflect one's gender.
- For the consideration of all, no radios, televisions, tape or CD players are permitted in the camps.
- Cell phones and pagers, if truly necessary, should be left turned off, or on "vibrate," and ONLY used out of the sight of the public. During museum hours please confine smoking to historic-style pipes or cigars: no cigarettes, please. Please use restraint in the use of camera's and modern recording devices in view of the public.
